FCC has begun Phase I of the  
 refund program for those who  
 paid license fees between  
 Aug. 1,1970 to Dec. 31,1976.  
 Those who paid MORE than \$20  
 in license fees, including  
 amateurs paying \$25 for special  
 call signs as well as all  
 commercial,marine stations,etc  
 are now eligible for a refund  
 of at least a portion of the  
 fees paid.

 of the cw message from NPG at  
 1800 UCT 28 July 79. The test  
 will be 25wpm on 4010, 7347.5

 to local amateur clubs,etc.  
 An ARRL bulletin will also be
