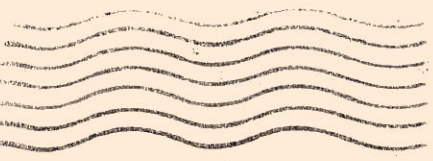
Large check-in on Golden State (Orange Co. section) Net on 3965 kc, Sunday at 10 a.m.
